


Your little effort can give others a second chance to live.

- Age must be between 18-65
- Weight must be above 45kg
- •One should not donate if suffering from cold, flu, sore throat, cold sore etc.
- One cannot donate if they are recently diagnosed with medical problems.

You don't need to be a doctor to save lives, one blood donor is capable of saving 3 lives.

Khusbu ma'am our committee mentor, is one my favorites teachers I have came across , with her constant support and digging ideas with us was


motivating.

MYEANCORD" - THE STORY

"Have no fear of perfection -- you'll never reach it." -- Salvador Dali, Artist. My journey started 2 years back when I joined Army institute of Fashion and Design. With guidance of all core faculty who are amazing at the subjects they deal with. It was always inspiring and interesting to study and learn new thing bought to us on the table. Though the preparation for final years competition begins from 2nd year mostly. It is advisable that you begin to plan and collect references, ideas on design as and when you see something interesting and different it can help you a lot in long run.



This habit of taking and saving references on art work, designers work and also what is taught in class and current affairs personally helped me a lot."WHATISTAUGHTINCLASS?!!WHAT!" ...in this article I am gonna tell you how it all happened!

Never stress a lot on finding a specific and unique stuff too much. I had lots of ideas on designs collected, but serious thought about my design collection and "whatwillitbeabout" was searched and found in the beginning of official third year, which is when announcement about the competition made.

Till that moment all the ideas were really random and could be said didn't make sense – there were just pictures of everything I found interesting-online, murals, malls and even Pinterest.



Let me first tell you about my theme - It was "MYEANCORD-THEDEPLETINGCORALREEF"

Myeancord is the word completely constructed by me representing-MYocEANCORalDepletion. It took me one day and many permutation & combinations to finally get to this beautiful word. Inspiration was to do something different and to give a proper unique name to my collection.

As the name suggests my collection spoke about the depletion of coral reef with relation that we humans take everything for granted and exploit, pollute all resources and kill species for our own personal interest. It is our human mentality that until and unless we are hit by a catastrophe due to our greediness we don't learn and not even realise what has happened and how it is gonna affect us in the end. Only we are at loss by disturbing the balance of nature and it is NOT anyone having right to do it.



The depleting coral reef can be the next catastrophe along with corona that we might have to face. So, my collection is the coral reefs dying voice representing – Livingcoral, Deadcoral, Justicia, Koifi.

I knew about coral reef from very long, like so beautiful and colourful living creatures in sea, but it poked my design interest during 5thsemester, where I learnt about coral stone as one of the magical stone. This fact I remembered while reading about coral reefs in News. Et voilà! I now got my very inspiration and started my research for the same. The resources I took help from wasgoogle and my DC encyclopaedia. When doing research, I realised that as much as 27 % of monitored reef formations have been lost and as much as 32 % are at risk of being lost within the next 32 years!!

I had to revise my designs max of 4 times due to its details, complexity, doubting on my stitching skill and availability of materials. It took me a week (including getting fabrics dyed) to procure fabrics once I came up finally with what I wanna represent. once procuring was done I had clear-cut idea of the silhouette I can show and finalise my design by finalising illustration with my fabrics on it.

So next was coming up with designs as I was representing the drastic transformation of live coral to dead dull coral then justice that spread awareness and lastly a dress representing the aquatic creatures (fishes in common). I kept in mind their characteristics individually, the same should be visible in my collection was the goal. I wanted to show the fluffy colourful coral, therefore I used net fabric dyed in pastels colours and made ruffles by hand. The dress was completely filled with ruffles in small pieces that was completelycut, ruffled and stitched onto base fabric by hand, took me 1 week of devoted work to complete it

For second garment of dead coral- I used a shimmery fabric used to make cowl neck fitted dress of double shade (light to dark) representing dawn to dusk (as it is death) and a symmetric hook fullness coat of dirty dust shade. Third garment was a sheath dress with shell shaped top portion made of red embroidered net on red satin (red – represents danger and having a distant vision) attached with double shade synthetic fabric shell cape. Lastly the Koifi garment was a pleated top ¼ circle skirt dress made of shibori tie and dye printed satin fabric.





Then what remained was cutting the fabrics and stitching which was completely done in college. The best thing was my designs resembled my illustrations more than 90% (was made a month before stitching garment). Finally, to the winning of the best designer award. I am thankful to my teachers for their guidance and jury for giving me this wonderful opportunity for participation and winning the title. So, the moral of this article is- Believe in yourself, keep your mind open to new ideas and opinions. I pro in stitching but I was honestly am not determined, you too should be. Discuss your ideas with your friends, teachers and even parents, they can help you if you face any problems (my friends and my parents helped me a lot) also don't give up and I would like to add give your best and TRY HARD but don't expect anything. Have you heard this quote-Once you work "hope for the best and prepare for the worst"? You need to be persistent and punctual but no need to take stress about anything. All will be well and all the best to everyone.

"Pay no mind" was the phrase printed on the sash flowing down the dress which stood for the P in Johnson's name according to her.
